## Experiencing Homelessness

Project Hope Alliance was summoned by the Grand Jury August 2022 to share our experience and expertise concerning student homelessness in Orange County and how it impacts a student's academic journey. We shared our innovative model of care, strategic community partnership model, and successful outcomes. The OC Grand Jury released their report May 25, 2023, entitled, "The ABCs of Educating Children Experiencing Homelessness in Orange County", highlighting what we have always known to be true: there are nearly 30,000 students experiencing homelessness in Orange County and we need to do more together to ensure all of our community's kids thrive inside and outside the classroom.

Says CEO, Jennifer Friend, "For the past decade, Project Hope Alliance's greatest challenge has been the invisibility of our kids. The Grand Jury's report has lifted that and demanded action on their behalf. When we have a community prioritize the unique needs of children experiencing homelessness, meeting the needs of the whole child while measurably improving their academic performance, incredible things happen inside and outside the classroom. We are grateful for our district, city, and nonprofit partners that are enabling us to end the cycle of generational homelessness."

## Hope in Action
