Mariana left an abusive home during her junior year and moved in with friends who offered her a couch to sleep on – this provided her with some semblance of stability. With the trauma caused by her home situation, Mariana found herself 80 credits behind in her senior year and at risk of not graduating.

Mariana was referred to the Project Hope Alliance office on her school campus; she enrolled in our program and started working with PHA case manager, Natalie. Working alongside Natalie, Mariana has received coaching, tutoring, as well as basic needs support for items like food, hygiene, and clothing.

Since the beginning of this school year and with encouragement and support from Natalie, Mariana has completed 25 credits and is now on track to graduate in June! Mariana visits Natalie and the Project Hope Alliance room every day during her lunch break to complete her schoolwork. Mariana is planning for her future and is excited about her journey ahead.
