# Youth Highlight



Johnny and his family first connected with Project Hope Alliance when they were living at a nearby motel. A few weeks later, they were evicted from the motel and needed support to ensure Johnny and his siblings would remain safe and continue to attend school. Our case managers worked tirelessly to connect Johnny's family to housing assistance programs including Costa Mesa City Outreach. Costa Mesa City Outreach provided motel vouchers, food, and other essentials while the family and our case managers searched for longer-term solutions.

Three months later, another trusted community partner, Families Forward, called with wonderful news – there was an apartment available! To celebrate the family's milestone, Project Hope Alliance took the family to IKEA to purchase their own household necessities like pots, pans, bath towels, and a few decorations to make their new house a home.

Despite his family's hardships, Johnny has stayed committed to school and his future. He has a 3.0 average, is fond of math, and recently discovered his love of music. Johnny feels most comfortable in band class. He has made many friends, loves reading music, and currently enjoys playing the trombone. His dream is to earn a scholarship and play for a university's band. He is currently working on achieving his goal of pursuing college with his Project Hope Alliance case manager, Stephanie.

Project Hope Alliance case manager, Stephanie, also supports Johnny's mom to access support programs like CalFresh and health insurance. Stephanie provides emotional support when life feels stressful and overwhelming for mom, too. Mom works hard, loves her children, and wants her children to focus on their education so they can have a brighter future.

Recently, Mom participated in our Hope for the Holidays drive and was very grateful to select gifts for her kids. Mom was amazed by the variety of beautiful gifts to choose from, especially the scooters, bikes, skateboards, and other gifts that would help her kids play outside. She also received gift cards to Denny's so her family could share a holiday meal together. Mom, dad, and the children have been so grateful for Project Hope Alliance's support, and they continue to work hard to build a brighter future together.
